Inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) has a significant impact on quality of life and healthcare costs. Measuring patient outcomes for continuous quality improvement (QI) has great potential for optimising health care quality. While many studies focus on the collection of data for IBD, few address the use of these outcomes in clinical practice. Despite access to high-quality data, improvements are often complicated by resource limitations, inadequate infrastructure, and misalignment with organizational strategies.

The Erasmus University of Rotterdam, Franciscus Gasthuis Hospital, and Erasmus Medical Centre are conducting a mixed-methods, multi-centre study to assess the readiness for outcomes-based QI in European IBD centres. We would like to invite you to participate in a web-based survey, covering monitoring of outcomes, available resources, and what health care providers (HCP) think of outcomes-based QI.

The study protocol has been reviewed by the Clinical Committee (ClinCom) of ECCO and is approved by the Ethical Review Board of Erasmus School of Health Policy and Management.
